DC Peace Team is about positive change and supporting the community. We are committed to unleashing the power of ordinary civilians growing their nonviolent skills and practices so we may all better resist injustice, and thus, build a more sustainable just peace.

The DC Peace Team lives this mission by:

- deploying unarmed civilian protection units
- providing training in key nonviolent skills

We offer sessions for skills such as Nonviolent Communication, Bystander Intervention, Restorative Circles, as well as Unarmed Civilian Protection and Accompaniment. We are a small team of staff supported by volunteers and interns who significantly contribute to the functions of our organization.

DC Peace Team is considering proposals from innovative and motivated interns to design and execute special projects that align with our mission of promoting peace and justice. This flexible internship is perfect for those passionate about peacebuilding, nonviolence, organizing, advocacy, and nonprofit work. The project should take 5-7 hours/week to complete in one traditional semester.

Application Process: Please send a cover letter, resume, one-page project proposal, & 2 references to fgortaire@dcpeaceteam.org. If the internship is part of a program or degree, please include the requirements set forth for the internship in your cover letter. Your project proposal should include how it ties to our mission and values, the deliverables or impact from it, the weekly hourly commitment, and the length of the internship to complete. We are open to other suggested areas of interest as well.
